



# **Delivery Costs: Births Paid by Medi-Cal** 2014

Births paid for by Medi-Cal is used as a proxy for low-income mothers.





Pre-term birth is the leading cause of newborn death and may contribute to long-term disabilities for infants.

# Prenatal Care: Initiated after 1st Trimester 2014

Mothers are advised to start prenatal care during their 1<sup>st</sup> trimester of pregnancy. Late entry into care may pose increased health risks to pregnant mothers and their babies.





# **Low-Birthweight Births: Birthweight Less than 5 lbs. 8 oz.**2014

Infants born below 5 pounds 8 ounces can be due to preterm birth or other pregnancy risk factors.




**In Sacramento County, African Americans** represent 48% of all juveniles arrested for a felony.
