The cohort is the group of students that could potentially graduate during a four-year period (grade 9 through grade 12). The four-year adjusted cohort includes students who enter 9<sup>th</sup> grade for the first time in the initial year of the four-years used for the cohort. The four-year graduation rate is calculated by dividing the number of students in the four-year adjusted cohort who graduate in four years or less (with either a traditional high school diploma, an adult education high school diploma, or have passed the California High School Proficiency Exam) by the number of students who form the adjusted cohort for that graduating class.

Note: The four-year adjusted cohort forms the basis for calculating graduation rates, dropout rates, and other related rates. The cohort is the group of students that could potentially graduate during a four-year period (grade 9 through grade 12). The four-year adjusted cohort includes students who enter 9th grade for the first time in the initial year of the four-years used for the cohort. The dropout rate is the rate of students that leave the 9-12 instructional system without a high school diploma, passing a high school equivalency exam, or special education certificate of completion, and do not remain enrolled after the end of the 4th year.
