COMMUNITY INCUBATOR LEAD DATA PROFILE

Crime & Safety FY2021 update

Crime and violence negatively impact communities by reducing productivity, decreasing property values, and disrupting social and emotional health and general well-being. This data profile highlights crime and safety data between July 1, 2021, and June 30, 2022 (FY2021), compared to July 1, 2016 - June 30, 2017 (FY 2016). Indicators include: Crime Statistics, Firearm Assaults, Arrests, Justice-Involved Youth, and Gang Activity. Community partners from the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department (SSD), the City of Sacramento Police Department (PD) and the Sacramento County Probation Department provided the data summarized herein.

Data presented in this report was produced for informational purposes only and is limited by the information available and/or collected at the time the statistics were generated.

This information is not a replacement for official Uniform Crime

Reporting (UCR) statistics, which are based on national reporting specifications

and not reflected in the information provided herein.

A NOTE ON METHODOLOGY

For each indicator, this report provides the definition, data source, dates for which it is reported, and a note why this indicator matters.

- To establish rates, indicators are normalized by population. Normalizing reflects
 concentration of crime relative to population, and allows for comparison across
 geographic areas, Five-year census population estimates were used to establish
 rates.
- Percent change noted throughout this report reflects change from baseline year
 (FY2016) to FY2021. Rates in the charts were rounded to a single decimal point, but
 calculation for changes use the full rate, which may include up to the one thousand
 decimal point. Therefore, rates calculate using a single decimal may vary.
- Disproportionality between rates for the African American population and all
- others is calculated by dividing the African American rate by the rate for all others.
- Data for FY2018 FY2019, FY2020 is included in the Appendices. Data for FY2017 is not included in this report, unless otherwise noted.

Some BCLC communities are served by both SSD and City PD, with community boundaries not aligning with law enforcement boundaries. To address this, most data from SSD and City PD are combined for neighborhoods unless otherwise noted.

Why This Matters to the Black Child Legacy Campaign

Different law enforcement agencies protect and serve different neighborhoods.

A law enforcement jurisdiction is a geographic area that law enforcement officers are sworn to protect and serve. The Black Child Legacy Campaign (BCLC) neighborhood zip code boundaries intersect with both the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department (SSD) and the City of Sacramento Police Department (City PD) to varying degrees. As shown in the map of Sacramento County below, some BCLC neighborhoods are served by City PD alone, by both City PD and SSD, or by SSD alone.

The data presented in this report display totals for SSD and City PD jurisdictions combined, SSD alone, City PD alone, the BCLC Focus Area, and individual BCLC neighborhoods. At the BCLC level, SSD and City PD data are aggregated. Totals for individual neighborhoods may or may not include SSD or City PD data, based on jurisdictional boundary.



Crime Statistics | Overall Crime

Why This Matters to the BCLC

Victims of violent and other crimes experience trauma that compromise psychological as well as physical wellbeing. Residents of communities with high crime rates are also affected, becoming more fearful and experiencing high levels of stress. Communities experiencing high rates of crime are affected economically, with decreased business activity and lower property values.

Overall Crime Rate


Measures the overall rate of crime in an area.

Definition

The overall crime rate captures the aggregate number of SSD and City PD reported incidents of homicide, rape, arson, robbery, burglary, larceny, shootings, and stolen vehicles per 1,000 residents who live in an area. Both victims of the offense and officer's viewing of an offense generate crime reports. Reported incidents are used instead of arrests since some crimes reported do not result in an arrest. Arrests are tracked separately. See Appendix A for FY2018 - FY2020 data.

Overall Crime Rate (per 1,000 residents)

Between FY2016-FY2021, the Overall Crime rate in the BCLC Focus Area decreased by 18%.

Violent Crime Rate


A subset of overall crime, measures the rate of violent crime in an area.

Definition

The violent crime rate captures the aggregate number of SSD and City PD reported incidents of overall crime identified as being violent (homicide, rape, robbery, and shootings) per 1,000 residents who live in an area. See Appendix B for FY2018 - FY2020 data.

Violent Crime Rate (per 1,000 residents)

Between FY2016-FY2021, the Violent Crime rate in the BCLC Focus Area decreased by 28%.

Property Crime Rate


A subset of overall crime, measures the rate of personal property crime in an area.

Definition

The property crime rate captures the aggregate number of SSD and City PD reported incidents of overall crime identified as being property-based (burglary, stolen vehicles, and larceny) per 1,000 residents who live in an area. See Appendix C for FY2018 - FY2020 data.

Property Crime Rate (per 1,000 residents)

Between FY2016-FY2021, the Property Crime rate in **BCLC Focus Area decreased by 17%.**

Crime Statistics | Specific Crimes

Specific Crimes

Measures the rate of specific crimes in an area.

Definition

The aggregate number of SSD and City PD reported incidents of specific crimes per 1,000 residents who live in an area. Select crimes are used to measure overall crime, and its subsets (violent crime and personal property crime). The graphs display changes over time in rates of firearm assaults, weapon possession, and weapon possession-firearm only (a subset of weapon possession). See Appendix D for tables displaying rates for these and other specific crimes.

*Note: Previous reports displayed "Shootings" data, with crime codes varying in some years. This report displays "Firearms Assault" data which includes the crime codes listed on the following page.

Firearm Assaults* (per 1,000 residents) Between FY2016-FY2021, the Firearm Assualt rate in the BCLC Focus Area decreased by 19%.

(per 1,000 residents)


Between FY2016-FY2021, the Firearm Only rate in the BCLC Focus Area decreased by 8%.

Between FY2016-FY2021, the Weapon Possession rate in the BCLC Focus Area decreased by 25%.



Firearm Assaults | Mapping Sacramento County

Why This Matters to the BCLC

Youth and young adults are more likely than persons of other ages to be murdered with a gun.

Firearm Assaults

Measures the number of firearm assaults in an area.

Definition

The aggregate number of SSD and City PD reported incidents of firearm assaults using the four firearm assault crime codes outlined below per 1,000 residents who live in an area. These crime codes are among the top offenses typically associated with gang violence. See Appendix D for FY2018-FY2020 data.



Firearm Assaults

Despite an increase in FY2020, firearm assaults have decreased in most BCLC neighborhoods from baseline year (FY2016), which is notated by the colored area in the graphs below. FY2017 data is not included in this report and therefore is represented with a dashed line. See Appendix D for data tables.







Research shows that the COVID-19 pandemic was associated with a temporary 15% increase in firearm-related incidents across the country, which occurred during FY2020.1

Gang Activity | Gang-Related Crime

Why This Matters to the BCLC

Gang activity affects all those who are exposed to the violence they perpetrate in the community. When young people feel unsafe, it can negatively affect their health and educational performance. Gang activity creates fear in communities, which in turn affects community cohesion, public health, and the economic wellbeing of a neighborhood.

Gang-Related Crime


Measures the rate of 186.22 crime for all individuals in an area.

Definition

The 186.22 crime rate captures the aggregate number of SSD and City PD reported incidents of crime with a street gang sentencing enhancement per 1,000 residents who live in an area. 186.22 crime makes it illegal to participate in a street gang and assist in any felony criminal conduct by the gang's members. Additionally, the law provides that anyone who commits a felony for the benefit of a gang will receive a mandatory prison sentence. See Appendix E for FY2018 -FY2020 data.

Between FY2016-FY2021, the 186.22 Crime rate in the BCLC Focus Area decreased by 84%.

Arrest Rate


Measures the rate of arrests for all individuals in an area.

Definition

The arrest rate is the aggregate number of SSD and City PD reported persons of any age arrested per 1,000 residents who live in an area. Due to differences in data calculation between the SSD and City PD, combined arrest rates per BCLC focus areas was not calculated. Separate tables for SSD and City PD arrest rates per focus area are provided in Appendix F, along with FY2018 - FY2020 data. Arrest Rate (per 1,000 residents)

Arrest Rate (per 1,000 residents)

Between FY2016-FY2021, the Arrest rate for SSD and City PD decreased by 14%. Similar decreases in arrest rates were reported by SSD and City PD in BCLC communities, as noted in Appendix F.

Arrests | Juvenile Arrest Rate

Why This Matters to the BCLC

Arrest records, even if they do not lead to conviction, can have a lasting effect on the employment opportunities for the juvenile arrested, which affects not only their own economic wellbeing but also that of their families. Employment is also linked to the avoidance of future involvement with law enforcement.

Iuvenile Arrest Rate

A subset of arrests for all individuals, measures the rate of arrests for juveniles in an area.

Definition

The juvenile arrest rate is the aggregate number of SSD and City PD reported persons aged 0-17 arrested per 1,000 youth 0-17 years-old who live in an area by race (African American - AA, All Other Races - AOR). Due to differences in data calculation between the SSD and City PD, combined arrest rates per BCLC focus areas was not calculated. Separate tables for SSD and City PD juvenile arrest rates per focus area are provided in Appendix G., along with FY 2018 - FY 2020 data.

Juvenile Arrest Rate

(per 1,000 residents ages 0-17)

Between FY2016-FY2021, the African American Juvenile Arrest rate for SSD and City PD decreased by 36%. However, it is still 9.6 times higher than the rate for all other races. Similar decreases in arrest rates were reported by SSD and City PD in BCLC communities, as noted in Appendix G.

Justice-Involved Youth | Youth on Probation

Why This Matters to the BCLC

Youth who have contact with the juvenile justice system are at increased risk for negative long-term outcomes, such as substance use and abuse, dropping out of school, injury, and early pregnancy.

Youth on Probation

Measures the rate of youth on probation in an area.

Definition

Youth on probation is the number of youth under the juvenile jurisdiction of Probation aged 0-21 per 1,000 youth who live in an area by race (African American – AA, All Other Races – AOR), at a unique point in time (June 1). Rates are calculated using the Census age range of 0-24. See Appendix H for FY2018 - FY2020 data.

Disclaimer

The zip code data may or may not reflect where the youth currently resides: the zip code may represent a group home, the youth may be transient, or various other factors. The zip code data listed is the zip code provided to probation for the youths during the specific snapshots.

Youth on Probation Rate

(per 1,000 residents ages 0-24)

Between FY2016-FY2021, the African American Youth on Probation rate in the BCLC Focus Area decreased by 43%. However, it is still 8.6 times higher than the rate for all other races.

Definition



Definition

These are the top five County Probation reported offenses (pre-conviction) for which youth aged 0-17 are admitted for secure detention per 1,000 youth 0-17 years-old by offense and race (African American – AA, All Other Races – AOR) in Sacramento County only, ranked highest to lowest. The top 5 offenses measure the most prevalent criminal and delinquent behavior by youth. See Appendix J for FY2018 - FY2020 data.
